





### EASY is an EU-funded project that aims to contribute to the integration of autistic youth into the labour market by enhancing their employability and job-seeking skills.

EASY aims to improve the project partners' capacity to support autistic people's competitiveness, increase youth workers' understanding of the autistic learners' diverse abilities, increase autistic youth's level of employability and help them claim their rightful place in local, national and European workforce, and increase the effects of inclusion in workplaces. ## **WHY EASY?**

Organisations and their youth workers across Europe cannot afford to retain a passive stance in the face of a situation that leaves more than 90% of the autistic European population unemployed. On the contrary, they can and should play a role in supporting young autistic people to develop their employability. The project intends to focus on the support that youth workers offer through informal and non-formal education to autistic youth for the development of their employability.

# The main results and deliverables the project aims to achieve are...

#### ...an Employment Journey Guide and Informal Activity Workbook:

The project will deliver a guide for youth workers to support the job- seeking process for young autistic people and an Activity Workbook with informal activities to teach autistic youth. A learning activity with youth workers and a piloting phase in each country will take place for evalua- tion of the results.

#### ...a Linear Scenario Simulator:

This relates to the development of an online simulator that will be based on a workplace scenario. Through questions, young autistic people will be able to assess their job-seeking abilities and their employability skills. A piloting phase will take place in each country for evaluation.

#### ...the development of a mobile app,

This serves as an information and referral platform for internships, mobilities, and employment opportunities at the EU level.
